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I Never Expected to Be in This Position

My name is Nicole. My husband and I have two children. I worked so hard to get my Master of Social Work Degree and loved spending my career helping others. A few years ago, I was diagnosed with a rare autoimmune disorder that eventually forced me to leave my job. It took a long time for my husband and I to adjust to the significant change in our income, but we have slowly rebuilt since then.

"Most days, we only have food on the table because of the Food Bank. As hard as it is to seek out the help, I am so, so thankful for this. It really makes all the difference for our family." My husband was out of work for several months when the pandemic first started, and our world was flipped upside down again. We only had my small disability check for income. His unemployment didn't process until after he was already back to work, and even now that he's working again, he's working a lot

less hours than he was before this started. It's going to take a long time for us to recover from the financial strain this has put on our family.

I feel like I'm constantly making impossible choices with the very little money we have now. Trying to decide whether to buy the things my kids need for school, pay the power bill or rent, or have insurance and gas for the car my husband needs to get to work is incredibly stressful. It's such a blessing to know that having food doesn't have to be on that list of choices. I'm used to being the one helping others, and asking for help from the Food Bank was very humbling. I really appreciate how kind and caring everyone is when we visit. Thank you.

For the thousands of families we serve each month, the struggle to put food on the table is just one of a long list of concerns they're facing every day. Your support means facing one less impossible choice.

It's an Honor to Serve These Communities

When Mike first joined the Food Bank team as a Nutrition Educator three years ago, he often had the opportunity to travel with our programs staff to Food Bank distributions across our entire service area. Mike found that he really enjoyed being able to see and learn more about the small, rural communities we serve, and he was excited to transition to the role of Programs Specialist when it came available.

Now, Mike spends most of his work week visiting communities throughout northern Nevada with our Mobile Harvest program. As Mobile Harvest continues to grow and expand into more communities, Mike says it's an honor to be able to be part of bringing this important resource to those who need it most.

"A lot of the communities we visit have so few resources. Some of them are lucky if they have even one grocery store. So, when we roll into town with the Mobile Harvest truck, you can see that it is really impactful for them to have access to these great, healthy options:" When Mike asks clients how the pandemic has effected their financial situation, most say it's put tremendous strain on their already stretched budgets. Not having to worry about feeding their families brings so much peace of mind. Mike says he's proud to be part of an organization that is always ready to rise to any challenges we may face.

"The people I work with all have such a heart for those we serve, and it makes me really proud to be part of this team. I've known that as long as I've worked here, but the past year it's been even more apparent."

Programs Spotlight

Mobile Harvest: 90,000 Square Miles of Fresh Produce and Hope



For so many of the families we serve, Mobile Harvest is a vital program that allows them to access the healthy, nutritious foods that can often feel out of reach. The Mobile Harvest program focuses on delivering fresh produce. For parents with a limited to no grocery budget, knowing that they are able to still provide the kinds of foods that their children need to grow and thrive is an incredible blessing.

Over the past two years, our Mobile Harvest program has seen significant growth, and this year our programs team is working hard to bring this fresh food to more rural communities than ever before. Since October 2020, the program has expanded into six new rural communities, including two tribal communities. We know that access to fresh produce can be especially challenging in the rural areas we serve, and we're so thankful to be able to provide this resource.

Already, we're seeing a lot of new faces at each monthly distribution as clients have been eager to share this new resource with neighbors and friends.

"People's eyes just get wide when they see how beautiful the produce is. For a lot of those visiting us, this kind of good, healthy food has been out of reach for a long time." -Mike
