LETTER FROM PRESIDENT AND BOARD CHAIR

Dear Friends of the Food Bank,

There has never been a time like the present to reflect on the work we do every day and its impact on the lives of those facing food insecurity. In our thirty-eight (38) years of operating, the Food Bank of Northern Nevada has experienced many changes but none as challenging as the past year. At the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, we immediately saw the increased need but what we experienced as the pandemic continued to create disruptions was far more illuminating for those in our community facing food insecurity. Too many children, families and seniors in our 90,000 square mile service area experience hunger on a daily basis, but just how deep their need is has become truly evident during this global pandemic. The circumstances of this time have enabled the Food Bank to enhance innovation and expand the reach of proven strategic programs and initiatives for addressing hunger in our communities. The incredible support that we have received along with the significant focus on hunger awareness across the country allowed the Food Bank to embark on some exciting targeted work to address equitable access for seniors, children and tribal communities.

This Annual Report shares not only the impact our work by the numbers but also shares sentiments of our neighbors whose gratitude is expressed daily when they know they can count on the Food Bank to be there to help them feed their families. Together, our partners, volunteers, the community and our donors have risen to this occasion.

The impact of more than 20 million meals distributed to families throughout our 90,000 square mile service area through local food pantries, shelters, child care programs, senior centers and direct service programs was made possible by collaboration and with the help of volunteers. In our service area, we are home to 27 tribal nations many of which are located in remote and under-resourced parts of our state. Our work in partnership with these communities, the Nevada Department of Agriculture, the Nevada Indian Commission and the Inter-Tribal Council of Nevada has been instrumental in adding 13 Tribal communities as partners and in helping build sustainable food sovereignty initiatives.

Your unwavering generosity and compassion have made it possible for all of us here at the Food Bank to meet every day with hope for a brighter tomorrow, resiliency to meet the unexpected, tenacity to navigate ever-changing dynamics and empathy for those whose circumstances are often beyond their control.

CHANGING NEED

The Food Bank of Northern Nevada (FBNN) has become a regional leader in hunger relief in the thirty-eight years since incorporation. From our simple beginnings as a food pantry in Reno, we have expanded our reach and multiplied our partnerships each year with the steady, singular mission of ending hunger in our region. Many of our innovative programs set our organization apart; however, nothing compares to the experience of facing the COVID-19 crisis in the early months of 2020. We learned as a team the extent of our adaptability and the resiliency of our organization. Our response to the sudden, exponential need for food was one of expansion, wherever we could, to feed the hungry in our region. We now have new partnerships, innovative new programs, and we deliver our Mobile Harvest to several rural and Tribal Communities.

We advocated for our clients to make sure that the waivers were in place for neighbors to receive food in the safest way possible. We also advocated at the state level supporting legislation that helps those we serve like SB 370—the Home Feeds Nevada Program designed to connect Nevada produced agricultural products to Nevada's two food banks. We were able to utilize Nevada Cares money to make better serve our clients including support for underserved populations and a much needed warehouse expansion.

Our 151 partner agencies remain invaluable team members in our efforts to end food insecurity in our region. They bring donated food from our hub to our neighbors in a variety of settings, from faith-based organizations to neighborhood food pantries. We partner with them by providing donated food at no cost as well as access to a cooperative food purchase program to fill in the gaps with foods often unavailable through the donation stream. We also offer TEFAP or government commodities along with fresh produce and other perishable food.

In FY21 our partner agencies received **16,592,168 lbs. of food**, the equivalent of **13,826,806 meals**. They in turn served **1,090,239 people** and **276,916 households**.

This amazing contribution allowed the Food Bank to deliver **20 million meals** to the children, seniors, families, and veterans who need them.

Volunteers help by sorting and packing food in the warehouse, assisting to distribute food through direct service programs such as Mobile Harvest, doing office work and helping with events.



PROGRAMS

Feeding Families

There are 151 organizations throughout our 90,000 square mile service area who distribute food to those in need. Partner Agencies are emergency food pantries, shelters, family resource centers and more, delivering 13.8 million meals last year.

The Mobile Harvest program distributes fresh produce and other perishable food directly to clients in the neighborhoods where they live. Mobile Harvest delivered more than 2 million meals to families during the year. Nutrition education helps families get the best nutrition for their budget.

SNAP (formerly food stamps) Outreach is a program that helps people get connected with SNAP benefits. SNAP outreach workers assist with the application and the in-person interview required to qualify for benefits. During the year, families were connected with more than 724,978 meals through SNAP applications submitted by the Food Bank.

Feeding Children

It is a great priority of the Food Bank of Northern Nevada to make sure that children have the food they need to be healthy and do well in school. The Food Bank partners with the school district to provide the School Pantry program. School Pantries are only possible with the support of the schools, counselors, teachers and administrators who distributed more than 222,052 meals to families throughout the year.

When children are out of school, Kids Cafe helps to bridge the gap with free meals. Kids Cafe is a USDA program sponsored by the Food Bank that offers free meals to children and youth when they are out of school. The programs are known through the USDA federal nutrition programs as CACFP and SFSP. These two programs include an after school meal and meals during school breaks or during the summer time.

Kids Cafe meals are available to all children between the ages of 1 and 18 and are always free.* Kids Cafe meal programs provided 592,457 meals to children this year, many through a grab and go model for safety during the pandemic year.

The Back-Pack Kids program offers weekend food to chronically hungry or homeless children distributed through the schools. The Back-Pack Kids program provided more than 53,177 meals throughout the year.

Senior Hunger

The Food Bank serves seniors through a variety of programs and even has a specialized nutrition program designed just for seniors. The CSFP program distributes monthly boxes of food to seniors in need. Boxes are distributed at many sites around northern Nevada and can include cheese, cereals, beans, rice or pasta and canned fruits and vegetables. CSFP is also supplemented by the Mobile Harvest Program and the Senior Supplemental Food program providing a total of more than 795,509 meals to low income seniors. Produce on Wheels is a new program is designed to get fresh produce to seniors where they are in more manageable quantities, while offering a place for seniors to gather and escape isolation. More than 54,000 meals were delivered to seniors via this farmers market style truck.

Meals from Crisis

The USDA program that resulted from the COVID crisis and a need to rescue food from farmers continued throughout the year. The Food Bank of Northern Nevada was able to supply 1,517,574 meals to families through this program. The Food Bank of Northern Nevada partners with the Nevada Department of Agriculture and the United States Department of Agriculture to effectively administer nutrition programs to those who need them.

SERVICE STATISTICS

During the fiscal year of **2020-2021**, the Food Bank of Northern Nevada distributed more than **20 million meals** to those who need them in the region.


