LETTER FROM PRESIDENT AND BOARD CHAIR

Dear Friends of the Food Bank,

As we close out another year, we are humbled by the continued generosity of time, spirit and resources that our community has provided to our efforts in the fight against hunger. For so many, economic conditions precipitated by the lingering effects of the pandemic have continued to impact household budgets. The need for food assistance remains persistent in our region and when compared to FY19, the number of those needing our help each month as risen 32%. During our last fiscal year, we have served an average of 120,012 people each month, which is a record high for the organization.

Despite the increased numbers of people needing food assistance, the Food Bank continues to transform our services through innovation for greater impact with those who are served. We expanded our Prescription Pantry program, which highlights the partnership with the medical community and food pantries into four new rural counties in Nevada. The Healthy Eating Research project aims to categorize our inventory through a color coded system based on the nutrition value of food that come into our warehouse for distribution. The year-long Feeding Our Community Survey will provide insight into the barriers of food access and will provide data regarding the underlying causes of food insecurity faced by people in the communities we serve.

Your support has made these trying times so much better for families who are facing food insecurity and has allowed us to look to the future for ways in which we can better serve *Healthy Food. Every Person. Every Day*.

PERSISTENT NEED

The Food Bank of Northern Nevada (FBNN) has seen record numbers of people needing assistance consistently throughout the year, averaging more than 120,000 people a month. The pandemic, followed by significant economic fluctuations and a high cost of living have left families struggling with their budgets and access to consistent food resources. Our 150 plus partner agencies continue to be vital in our efforts to distributing food throughout our 90,000 square mile service area. These partners are so very important as we distribute food to the far reaches of the region. In FY22 our partner agencies received 15,187,568 lbs. of food, the equivalent of 12,656,306 meals. In total, FBNN, through partners and direct-service programs, provided 17.1 million meals to neighbors who need them.

As throughout the history of the organization, continual improvement of programs and initiatives is informed by data. The Food Bank completed a year'-long data collection process in FY22. The project was an extensive survey of those who receive assistance from the Food Bank of Northern Nevada and our partners, called the Feeding Our Community Survey.

Neighbors served by the organization were asked questions to help identify and understand barriers to food access, underlying issues causing food insecurity and their experience with FBNN programs and services.

"We knew the effort would be significant, especially as we were still battling effects of the pandemic, but knowing what our neighbors were facing was more important than ever," explained Nicole Lamboley, president & CEO of the Food Bank of Northern Nevada. "One thing that we are always sure about as an organization is that we want to do our work better each year. Information and data like this helps us to do that."

FBNN contracted with the Nevada Center for Surveys, Evaluation, and Statistics (CSES) at the University of Nevada, Reno, to conduct the year-long survey project.

The Food Bank will use the data released in FY23 to inform the community of what neighbors face each day as it relates to food insecurity. We will also identify barriers to service and make changes that benefit the community as a whole.

This amazing contribution allowed the Food Bank to deliver **17.1 million meals** to the children, seniors, families, and veterans who need them.

Volunteers help by sorting and packing food in the warehouse, assisting to distribute food through direct service programs such as Mobile Harvest, doing office work and helping with events.



PROGRAM UPDATES

Advocacy Feeds Children

Child hunger is one of the most serious issues we face as a community. FBNN worked with Feeding America, and the Nevada Department of Agriculture to extend the pandemic flexibility needed to administer programs such as Kids Cafe, allowing for grab-and-go meals. As a result, more than 350,000 meals were delivered during the last fiscal year helping children with meals after school and during breaks.

Produce On Wheels

A program getting rave reviews from seniors is Produce on Wheels. The Produce on Wheels truck rolls into low-income senior apartment complexes and senior centers to provide fresh fruits and vegetables in a farmers-market-style, dignified experience. Older neighbors can see the produce displayed in bins accessible from the side of the truck, and volunteers help them select the items they would like.

Seniors often gather at the Produce on Wheels truck to socialize with each other. Produce on Wheels not only provides fresh produce but social interaction that is important for health and mental wellbeing.

Produce on Wheels rounds out the other programs FBNN offers to help our older neighbors which include Golden Groceries food pantries that provide healthy foods, nutrition education and special hours of operation so seniors can meet and socialize with other seniors in a no-rush environment and the Senior Food Box program that provides staple food items.

An Emphasis on Nutrition

Access to nutritious food is important for all families and the Food Bank of Northern Nevada has implemented the Healthy Eating Research guidelines to identify foods that are distributed, by nutritional value. The system uses a color coding SWAP system (Supporting Wellness at Pantries) to put foods into categories. Foods low in saturated fat, sodium or sugar and that support overall health are coded green, and our partner agencies operating pantries should choose those most often. Foods that have medium levels of fat, sodium or sugar that might contribute to good health are coded yellow and should be selected sometimes. Foods coded red are those that are high in fat, sodium or sugar and should be selected rarely because of their limited health benefits. This system is used to inform the Healthy Pantry Initiative offering agencies easy ways to inspire healthy eating through knowledge and access.

Another program making great strides with nutrition is the Prescription Pantry program, started in 2017. The program began working with primary healthcare providers in Washoe County who screen patients to determine if they are food insecure. If they are, patients receive a prescription for healthy foods that can improve health conditions such as diabetes. Prescriptions are redeemed at FBNN partner food pantries. Prescribed foods include fresh fruit and vegetables, lower fat foods, whole grains, and lean proteins. FBNN strives to strike a balance between foods that are healthy and culturally sensitive and continuously gathers input from partner agencies and clients to tweak the mix of foods.

Results have been significant and positive. Of patients that visited a healthy pantry four or more times in a year, and had at least two hemoglobin A1C blood draws, 66% had A1C levels trending down. After 12 visits to a pantry, a patient reduced their A1C from 17.7 to 10.8.

With the promising results from the first few years, FBNN has begun expansion of the program in Carson City, Elko County, Mineral County and Lyon County.

During the fiscal year of **2021-2022**, the Food Bank of Northern Nevada distributed more than 17.1 **million meals** to those who need them in the region.




