But because they are both retired, his fixed income isn't always enough to cover every expense. So when Edmund heard about the Mobile Harvest distribution at the Senior Center, he decided to check it out.

The most nutritious foods, like proteins and produce, are often the most expensive. That can make it difficult for retirees to afford them — but you help ensure that, no matter what, food access is available and accessible.
