It's been three years since Robert, Tiffany, and their six children left the bustling Bay Area of California for rural northern Nevada. Tiffany's mother runs a ranch in the area, and the family wanted to be nearer to help out.

As everyone has settled into a new home and routine, Robert and Tiffany have been so grateful to her mother for her recommendations of nearby places to check out. One of those places? The local food pantry, supplied by the Food Bank of Northern Nevada.

Robert says, "we came here with her mother and then we were like, oh, this is great!

It's wonderful. So we started coming now ourselves."

"You guys are just a lifesaver," Tiffany says. She's talking about the difference you've made for her family — especially since the cost of living has remained so high, the weekly grocery bill isn't always affordable.

With a family of eight, Robert says, the cost of groceries can easily exceed \$400 per week — too much for Robert and Tiffany to afford even with both of them working.

With the support of the food pantry and friends like you, that bill is halved, and the



family can still pick up nutritious food like meat, milk, canned goods, and more to make healthy meals.

"The most expensive things to get at the store is usually what we find helpful here," Robert says, adding that "this place saves us more money than we spend."

Wanting to ensure the whole family has access to nutritious food, Robert and Tiffany often pick up food to share with Tiffany's mom, as well as her brother's family of four.

YOU SHARE HEALTHY MEALS WITH PAM

Five years after retiring, Pam and her husband moved from San Diego to Yerington, Nevada. When we asked how she likes being a part of the community, she said, "I love it. I love giving back."
